We are specialists in the treatment of patients over the age of 18. The hospital has two wards - Heathside Unit and Thames Brain Injury Rehabilitation Unit. Across the two wards, we provide assessment, rehabilitation, support and care.

Our team work closely together to ensure that every one is working towards the same practical, realistic goals and that all therapies are focused on the areas that will enable patients to achieve those clearly defined and agreed goals. Delivered by our Multi-Disciplinary Team, therapies offered at Blackheath include physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech and language therapy and psychological therapy.

Thames Brain Injury Rehabilitation Unit Level 1 regional specialist rehabilitation

This regional service is for people with complex cognitive and/or behavioural problems following a brain injury or as a result of a neurological condition. They have complex nursing and therapy needs requiring input from a highly specialist Multi-Disciplinary Team.

Patients are often in the very early stages of recovery from their brain injury and are usually admitted from an acute hospital once they are medically stable.

Heathside Unit Level 2 specialist rehabilitation

This service is suitable for people who require specialist inpatient rehabilitation and have ongoing physical therapy needs.

We support those with but are not limited to:

- Acquired brain injury
- Spasticity management
- Polytrauma
- Cognitive issues
- Behavioural difficulties
- Guillain Barré syndrome
- Critical illness neuropathy
- Polymyositis
- Neurodegenerative disorders
- Other complex needs
